- When we spend time with God, we begin to experience His love
- · How? Develop the skill of Quiet Time

Important Quiet Time Guidelines

1. **Time, Place, Plan**. Choose a time and place to have your daily Quiet Time. Make an appointment with God. The same time and place every day. Set aside this time in advance.

What time? Morning? Evening? Before bed? Where to start? John, Acts, Paul's letters

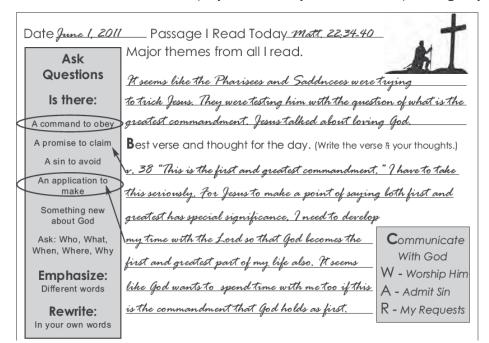
- 2. Eliminate distractions. No phone! If you use a device, then turn off ALL notifications. Do not miss out on Q.T. because of social media. 2 Corinthians 11:3
- 3. **Go to bed early enough** so you wake up refreshed. Greg Ogden: "The battle for the daily quiet time is often lost the night before." Do not sabotage your morning Quiet Time by staying up late the night before. Mark 1:35
- 4. **Find an Ally. Accountability** is KEY. If we are going to start a new lifelong habit that the Enemy is committed to defeat, we must have brothers who hold us accountable and gently pick us up when we fall. Eccl 4:9-10

Skill: The ABC's of Having a Quiet Time

A: Ask questions

Command to obey? Promise to claim? Sin to avoid? Application to make? Something new about God? Who? What?

- **B:** Best Verse choose a Best Verse and write it down.
 - Record your best thoughts on this verse. Read the verse in several translations.
 - What is God trying to speak to you? How can I apply this verse in my life today?
- **C:** Communicate with God in prayer whatever you feel He is impressing on you.

Do a Quiet Time on John 15:4-8. 4 "Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. 5 I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. 6 If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned.7 If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. 8 This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples."
