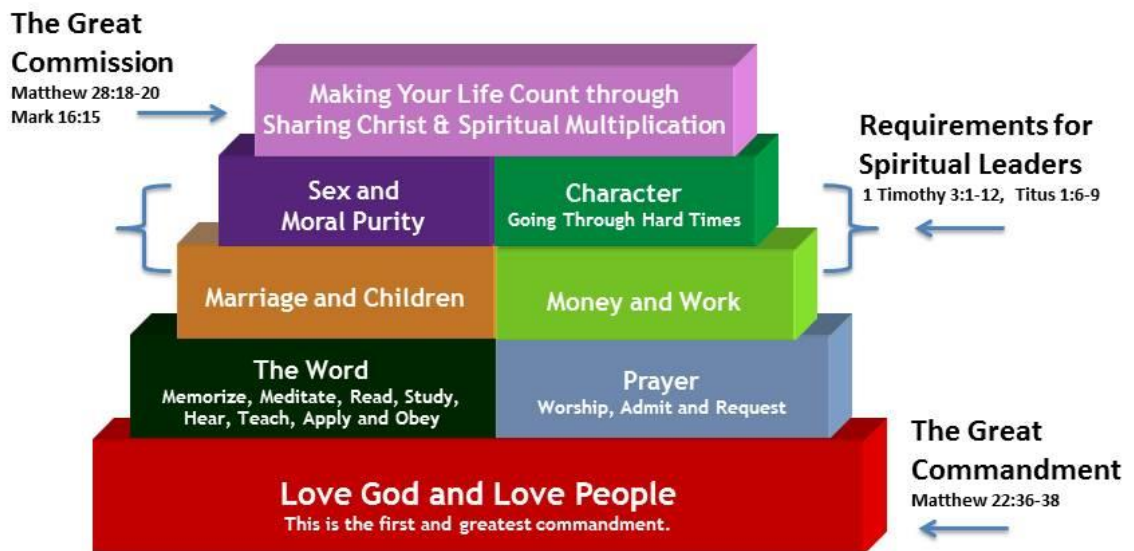

Titus 1:6-9

⁶ *An elder must be blameless, faithful to his wife, a man whose children believe and are not open to the charge of being wild and disobedient.* ⁷ Since an overseer manages God's household, he must be blameless—not overbearing, not quick-tempered, not given to drunkenness, not violent, NOT PURSUING DISHONEST GAIN. ⁸ Rather, he must be hospitable, one who loves what is good, who is self-controlled, upright, holy and disciplined. ⁹ He must hold firmly to the trustworthy message as it has been taught, so that he can encourage others by sound doctrine and refute those who oppose it.

Here is a trustworthy saying: Whoever aspires to be an overseer desires a noble task. ² Now the overseer is to be above reproach, faithful to his wife, temperate, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, ³ not given to drunkenness, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, NOT A LOVER OF MONEY.

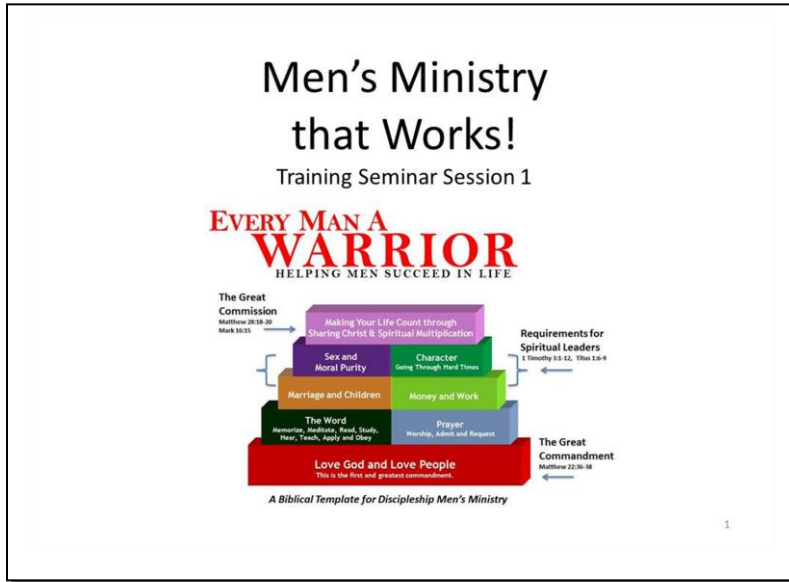





"Sexual and Moral Purity" is a prerequisite for spiritual leadership and is a huge battle for most men.

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

90% of a man's life energy will be consumed by the issues of: **Money, Marriage, Raising Children, Sex, Moral Purity, Work and Going through Hard Times**. Does it make sense that we should help Christian men discover Biblical principles on these areas if they are to succeed in life? Which of these topics do you most need help in?

Do you believe we have a Biblical Template from 1 Tim 3, Titus 1, The Great Commandment and Great Commission for Men's Ministry? Why or why not?

Would you be willing to be part of a Men's Ministry Development team that would go through the Every Man A Warrior materials in year 1 in order to experience the materials? Then in year two each man of this team would lead a group in the church?
